As for Nexus Primary School, the intention was clear this year, as the school saw an increase of young aspiring scientists moving from four (4) participants last year to eleven (11) this year with their amazing projects. According to the organisers, this year there were twenty-seven (27) learners in engineering category from grade 5 up to 7. Out of

these learners, it was with great excitement for the school to have five (5) learners who got silver, four (4) got bronze and the school was also awarded an accolade of the best project in the category of engineering. The learner behind the best project Naledi Motaung who is doing grade 6 when asked about her project after learning that her project was regarded as the best in her category had this to say, "I'm aesthetic, I feel like I'm on top of the world, it's like a dream." She added that her main aim with the project was to help people who are blind and deaf, basically promoting inclusivity, as well as people who live in rural areas as they are mostly relying on wood fire / coal to keep warm thus the "air purifier" can alert people in case of fire.
