1. WHAT IS WARD COMMITTEE?

Ward Committees are voluntary bodies established by municipalities in terms of Part 4 of chapter 4, Sections 72 to 75 of the Municipal Structures Act, No 117 of 1998. Ward Committees are established to assist and work with the Ward Councillor to amongst other things do the

- a) Express the needs and concerns of the residents within the ward
- b) Identify development priorities within the ward
- Promote and facilitate interaction between the Council & the community in particular ward
- d) Respond to the concerns of the residents within the ward
- e) Involve the residents in the ward in identifying and prioritizing needs

2. CRITERIA FOR PEOPLE WHO MAY STAND FOR ELECTIONS

He/she must be at least 18 years or older on the date of the election

- a) He/she must be a South African citizen with a bar-coded identify document or a smartcard
- He/she must be a registered voter
- c) He/she must reside in the specific Ward that he/she is availing himself/herself
- d) He/she must not have a criminal record or and offence and sentenced to imprisonment
- e) He/she is not an employee of Maluti-a-Phofung Local Municipality
- f) He/she must be active in the sector they represent

3. TO QUALIFY FOR ELECTIONS, THE NOMINATION OF EACH CANDIDATE MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE

A candidate can only be nominated by another person who is eligible to vote in the election of that specific ward;

- a) A candidate's nomination must be signed by the nominator and seconded by twenty (20) of persons who are eligible to vote in the election of that specific ward;
- The candidate can only be nominated by means of the prescribed form issued by the Municipality; and
- The nomination form must specify the sector or geographic area that the nominee

4. TO BE ABLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ELECTIONS, A PERSON MUST:

- a) Be at least 18 years or older on the date of the election
- b) Be a South African citizen with a bar-coded identity document
- Reside in the specific ward that he/she is availing himself/herself to be elected
- d) Not have a criminal record
- Not be an employee of the Municipality, District Municipality and Sector Departments
- Be a registered voter in that specific ward

ESTABLISHMENT OF WARD COMMITTEES

Section 16 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, No. 32 of 2000 as amended (Systems Act), requires that a municipality must develop a culture of municipal governance that complements formal representative government with a system of participatory governance, and must encourage, and create conditions for, the local community to participate in the affairs of the municipality. Section 17 of the Systems Act states that the participation by the local community in the affairs of the municipality must take place through political structures for participation, Section 73 of the Local Government; Municipal Structures Act. No. 117 of 1998 as amended requires that the municipality must establish ward committees as a means of participatory democracy.

Ward Committees provide communities with a platform for participating in planning, monitoring and budgeting to address community needs. This enhances communication and involvement with the communities as a whole. To this effect, dates for the establishment of the ward committees are as follows and communities of respective wards are requested to play an active part in the election of ward committees; Ward Committee Establishment Meetings' Schedule.
